Go to the British parliament, the German parliament, the French Parliament, Spanish, Italian... as if I were in Political campaign. When where you should have been is at a table of negotiations."

The Major General of the Forces Ukrainian armed forces, now retired, former Deputy Secretary of the Council Minister of National Security and Defense of Ukraine, Serhiy Krivonos stated: "This colossal mistake has led to the deaths of hundreds of thousands of Ukrainians, the destruction of a large number of cities... The People should demand a change of power in the country."

"Why did the war? Because President Zelensky took power without any preparation... and made a series of global mistakes in many areas." These are the words of one of the closest collaborators of the former President Poroshenko, former Prosecutor General of Ukraine Yuri Lutsenko.
