Sunday: 51 Iraqis Killed, 95 Wounded

In a still developing story, a significant number of woshippers were killed in an operation that liberated dozens of hostages at a Baghdad church. At least **51 Iraqis were killed and 95 more were wounded** not only at the church but also in an uptick of violence that greeted the new week. The casualty toll is expected to rise.

In **Baghdad**, gunmen killed two policemen and wounded eight others when they tried to storm the stock exchange using grenades or even a <u>car bomb</u>. The perpetrators then took refuge inside a **Catholic** church in *Karrada*, where they held scores of hostages. Although details are unclear, nineteen **nuns** were <u>released</u> early in the day as the gunmen demanded the release of al-Qaeda members in Iraq and Egypt. One witness <u>said</u> the gunmen did not have Iraqi accents, bostering the claim that they wanted Egyptian as well as Iraqi detainees released. At least <u>37 more people were killed</u>, including a <u>priest</u>, either after security forces stormed the church or <u>earlier in the ordeal</u>. Some estimates place the death toll even higher. At least <u>56 people were also wounded</u> and about <u>120 hostages were freed</u>. The fate of gunmen is unclear, but they may all be dead, either from their own suicide vests or killed by security forces. **U.S. forces** said that only <u>air support</u> was provided during the operation, but American troops were <u>reported</u> on scene as well.

Elsewhere in the capital, <u>six people were killed and four more wounded</u> when a bomb at a garage exploded in a northern neighborhood. A blast <u>wounded three people</u>, including a civilian, in *Saidiya*. Separate bombs in *Doura* <u>wounded five more Iraqis</u>.

In **Mosul**, a <u>suicide bomber killed one policeman and wounded seven more</u> in *Bursa*. Mortars <u>wounded four soldiers</u> when they landed at an army base. <u>Three civilians were</u> <u>injured</u> in a *Tahrir* roadside bomb blast, while in *Tel al-Rummam* another bombing left three policemen with injuries.

A sticky bomb planted on an Awakening Council member's car in **Taji** <u>killed him and</u> <u>wounded three bystanders</u>.

A sticky bomb in **Baquba** <u>wounded the husband</u> of a Diyala council member.

A roadside bomb targeting a former State of Law party M.P. in **Khalis** <u>killed his office</u> <u>manager and wounded a guard</u>.

Two teenage brothers were found shot to death in Wujaihiyah.

A suspected al-Qaeda emir was <u>captured</u> in **Qara Tappa**.

Twenty-three suspects were <u>arrested</u> in **Karbala**.

A suicide bomber wounded 32 people in **Istanbul** in what Turkish officials believe was a **Kurdistan Workers Party** (PKK) <u>attack</u>.
